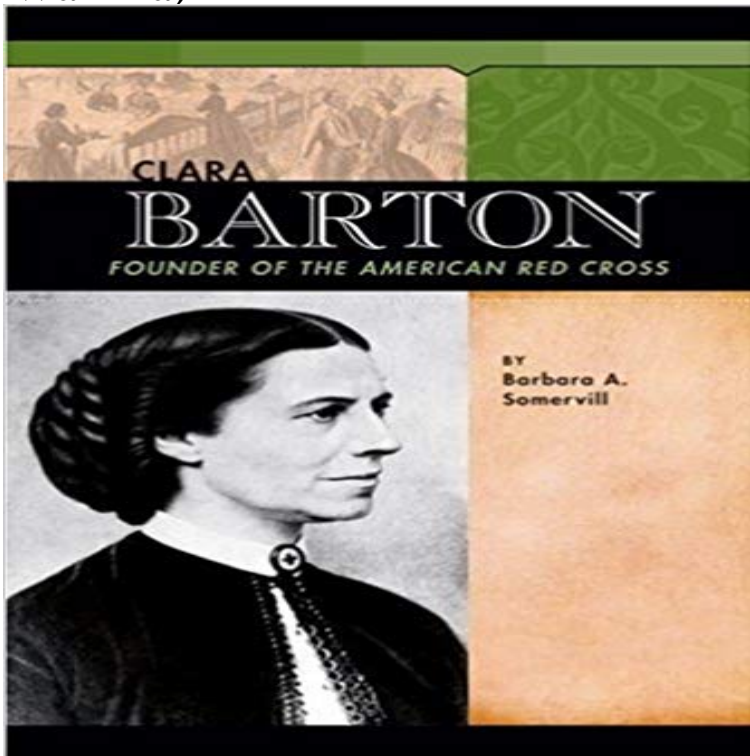


Clara Barton: Founder of the American Red Cross (Signature Lives: Civil War Era)
