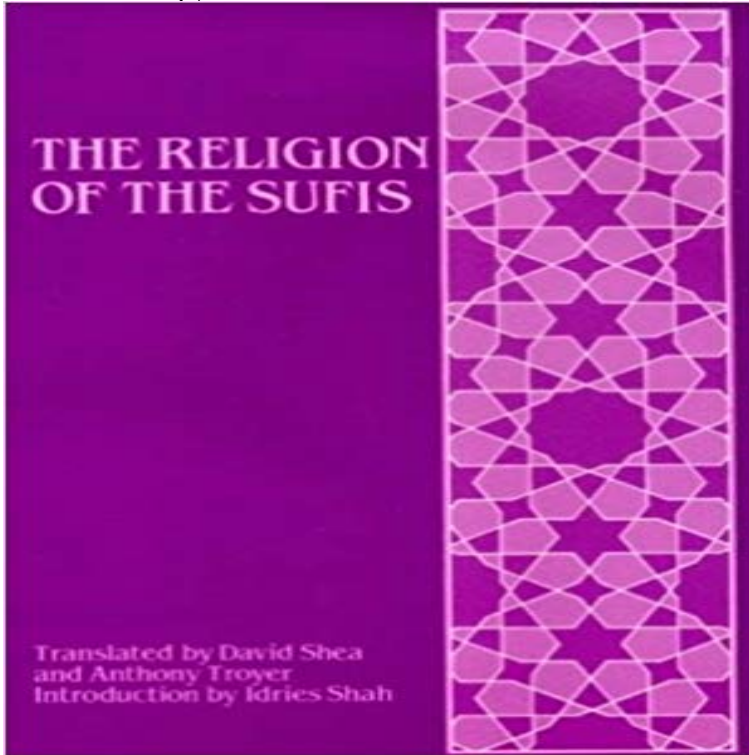


The Religion of the Sufis : From The Dabistan of Mohsin Fani
