He created his first group of sunflowers while living in Paris in 1887. The Irish-born British painter Francis Bacon (1909-1992) is one of the many artists to be inspired by Van Gogh. He drew inspiration from the severity of Van Dutch-born American artist Willem de Kooning (1904-1997) and Van Gogh both wanted to express the essence of an image using colour and brushwork.
