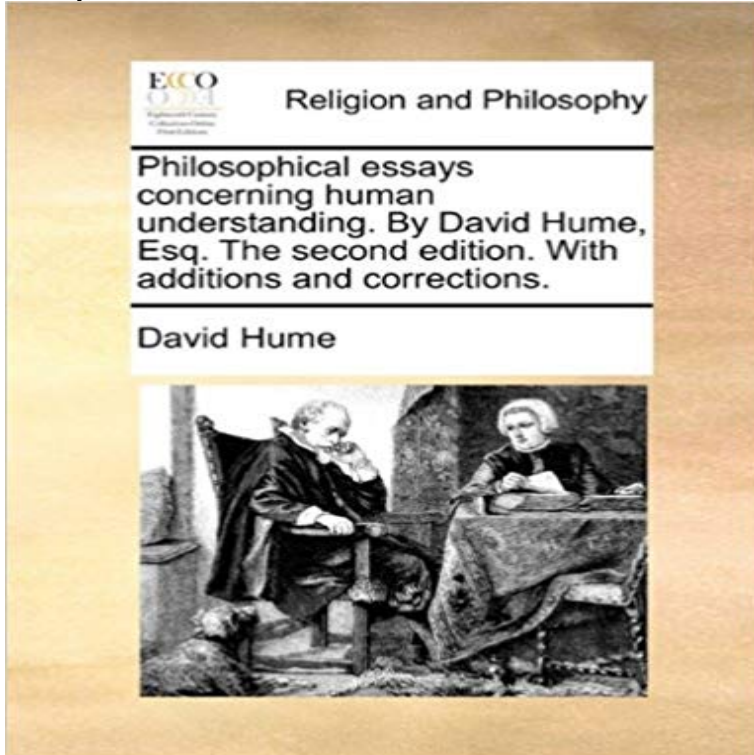


Philosophical essays concerning human understanding. By David Hume, Esq. The second edition. With additions and corrections.
