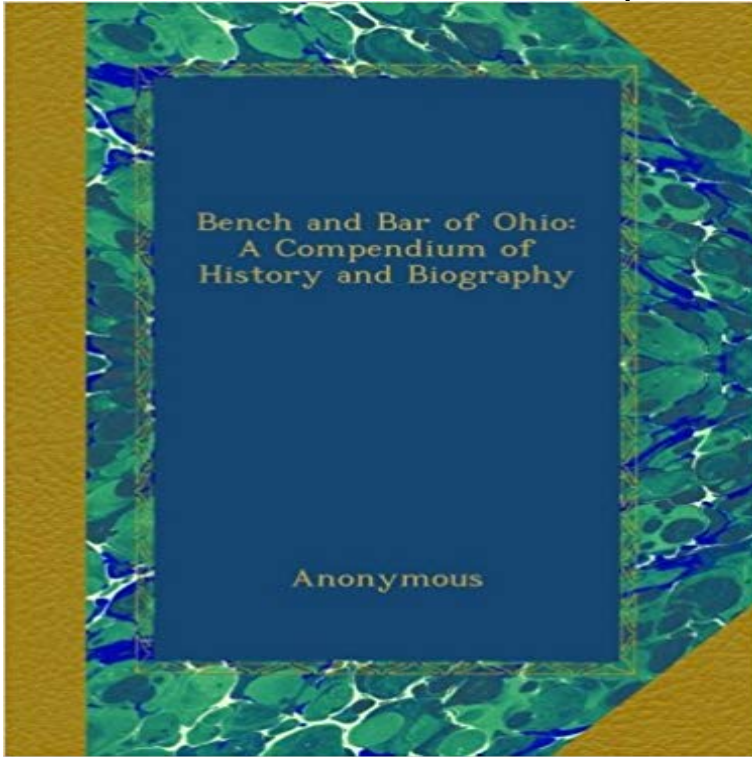


Bench and Bar of Ohio: A Compendium of History and Biography
